



Apeejay Kolkata Literary Festival to host fourth edition from 9th-13th January 2013

Kolkata, 6th December, 2012: Apeejay Surrendra Group and Oxford Bookstores today announced the fourth edition of the Apeejay Kolkata Literary Festival, 2013 (AKLF 2013) to be hosted in Kolkata from 9th -13th January 2013. In its fourth edition AKLF 2013, has built on several unique concepts which are slowly becoming integral traditions of this festival. Very uniquely for a literary festival, AKLF 2013 will take you on a journey to discover the quaint and hidden charms of Kolkata. From an evening at Victoria Memorial, to a twilight graveyard conversation at St. John's Church, a warm January afternoon at the historic Lascar Monument or a night on the banks of the Hooghly under the stars, AKLF 2013 will mark a new experience for literary festival audiences. This concept which has bloomed this year started with experiences of a tram journey in AKLF 2011 and an evening of poetry and gazals at the magnificent Town Hall in AKLF 2012.

The festival is seeing increased interest and participation from global talents. Last year while Sheila Malovany-Chevallier from France and Bi Feiyu from China caught the interest of Indian audiences, the horizons have expanded with participations from UK, Germany, France, Norway, Malaysia and neighbours Pakistan and Bangladesh this year.

Among other themes, AKLF 2013 will be celebrating 'A Century of Indian Cinema' which aims to curate unique encounters and memorable discussions showcasing the changing phases of Indian Cinema. Also one of the firsts, Apeejay Kolkata Literary Festival has partnered with the prestigious Tibor Jones South Asia Prize 2013, honouring budding authors from South Asian region. AKLF 2013 promises to be an exciting journey with a plethora of prize winning authors, award winning filmmakers, literati, poets, and artists participating in an array of some of the finest literary events of 2013 over a period of **five days**.

Setting in the theme for the year and providing the first glimpse of the upcoming festival, a special panel discussion followed with distinguished personalities; **Barun Chanda**, veteran film actor, **Bickram Ghosh**, renowned percussionist and composer, **Nageen Tanvir**, vocalist and theatre personality, **Naveen Kishore**, Publisher, Seagull Books and **Oindrilla Dutt**, prominent cultural events presenter, who also shared their experience of the festival over the last four years.

The inaugural event of Apeejay Kolkata Literary Festival 2013 will be hosted amidst the grandeur of the Victoria Memorial, commencing with a tribute to 'A Century of Indian Cinema' by eminent filmmaker Shyam Benegal, showcasing both classic and cutting edge experimental films that India






produced. The festival will also commemorate the centenary of Saddat Hasan Manto, legendary Pakistani writer in Urdu language with a special performance by the National Academy of Performing Arts, Karachi and eminent personalities Tom Alter, Pavan Verma and Barun Chanda. Titled When Ghalib Met Manto - Ek Guftagu the event will present a dramatised dialogue between two literary greats of India and Pakistan; Mirza Ghalib and Saddat Hasan Manto from their respective graves against the surreal background of St. John's Church, Kolkata, where the founder of Kolkata, Job Charnock, lies buried. Renowned Indian historian Ramchandra Guha is all set to take the stage and expound on 'What kind of Asian was Gandhi?' Bengali literature will be celebrated with a tribute to legendary writer Sunil Gangopadhyay by Antara Devsen and other leading littérateurs of the city. Distinguished author and Justice Leila Seth will be interacting with young readers on 'We the Children of India' - a Preamble to the Constitution of India. Apart from book launches by William Darlymple, Yasmeen Premji, Pavan Verma and others, there will be select discussions by international authors Yasmin Ali Bhai Brown, Kenize Mourad, Inka Parei, Dorothy Elminger, Mira Hashmi, Farah Ghuznavi, Katy Derbyshire and others. An exclusive literary afternoon will also be hosted on the verdant grounds of the historic Lascar Monument in Kolkata. The highlight of the festival - the **Tibor-Jones South Asia Prize** 2013 award ceremony will be held on January 10th, 2013 as part of the ongoing Apeejay Kolkata Literary festival. The five day long, multi-faceted event has several stimulating components designed to give visitors and the audience an enriching experience, with a great blend of literature, culture, art and heritage.
