

# Fifth edition of Apeejay Bangla Sahitya Utsob commences at Jorasanko Thakur Bari

<u>Kolkata, 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2019:</u> The fifth edition of Apeejay Bangla Sahitya Utsob was inaugurated today at Jorasankho Thakurbari, the birthplace of Gurudev Tagore in the distinguished presence of eminent writers Shankha Ghosh; Professor Syed Manjurul Islam and editor, publisher Majharul Islam from Bangladesh and Pracheta Gupta along with Prof. Sabyasachi Basu Ray Chaudhury, Vice Chancellor, Rabindra Bharati University; Tridib Kumar Chattopadhyay, MD Patra Bharati Group of Publications and Swagat Sengupta, Director Apeejay Bangla Sahitya Utsob and CEO Apeejay Oxford Bookstores. ABSU is presented in association with Patra Bharati Group and supported by Rabindra Bharati University.

The inauguration was preceded by a one-of-a-kind literary discussion with different Facebook Page Groups who work towards promoting new-age Bangla literature in the society; and a panel discussion tracing the evolution of Bangla Magazines to Webzines-titled **Little Magazine Theke Webzine- Cholar Pothe Chine Nin-** with Tapash Bhowmick (Korok), Prasun Bhowmick (Bijalpa), Debjyoti Bhattacharya (Joydhak), Dipankar Choudhury (Parobash) and moderated by Jayanta Dey. The inauguration was soon followed by interesting panel discussions on innovative and new areas of Bangla literature ranging from historical fiction to comedy. The panel – Jara Pori, Jara Porai, Dui Dol-e Somane Somane Korchi Borai! (Publishers V/s **Readers)** had Sudhanshu Dey, Majharaul Islam, Chumki Chattopadhyay, Rupa Majumdar and for the first time brought publishers and readers face-to-face to discuss the issues in publishing. **Eta Oitihasik Sotti, Bhalo Sahityo Itihashe Bhorti! (Writing the Past: Historical Literature in Bengali) brought** forth the intricacies of historical writing with Debotosh Das, Krishnendu Mukhopadhyay, Abul Kashem and Himadrikishore Dasgupta followed by the launch of Kashem's new book. The first day sessions ended with laughter and hilarity with



the panel **Mojae Meje Gechi, Tai Hashite Bachi (Who's laughing? Comedy in Bengali Literature)** which brought together stalwarts of Bangla comic writing, Sanjib Chattopadhyay, Subhashish Mukhopadhyay, Saikat Mukhopadhyay, Mirchi Somak and Pracheta Gupta. The evening wrapped up with the famous Light and Sound Show, a speciality of the Jorasankho Thakurbari, tracing the history and contributions of Rabindranath Tagore.

Speaking to the reporters during the Utsob, **Swagat Sengupta, CEO Oxford Bookstores & ABSU Director** said, *"India's first Bangla Literary Festival, Apeejay Bangla Sahitya Utsob created by the nearly 100 year old Oxford Bookstores in 2015 is in its 5th year. The Utsob aims to bring in new elements for its audiences since inception and one of our endeavor for our milestone fifth edition is to come up with ABSU's own theme music. The almost 1- minute theme music is a first for Apeejay Bangla Sahitya Utsob. Patra Bharti and Oxford Bookstores have jointly hosted ABSU inside Oxford Bookstore, moved to the much larger Apeejay House Lawns and now have the honour of hosting ABSU in the courtyard of Jorasankho Thakurbari for the second year. That the courtyard of the birth place of Nobel Laureate Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore will ring with ABSU theme music this year is a matter of great pride for us."* 

Present at the occasion **Mr. Tridib Kumar Chattopadhyay, Managing Director, Patra Bharati Group of Publications** said, "Apeejay Bangla Sahitya Utsob is world's first and the only Bengali literature festival, which will be stepping onto its fifth edition this year. The Utsob starts on 22nd November, and goes on till 24th November, Sunday. Adding a unique flavour this year are five eminent authors-publishers coming from Bangladesh, the only country in the world with Bengali as its national language."

Speaking about the special sessions in the 5<sup>th</sup> edition the **Utsob Director Mr. Sengupta** shared "ABSU 2019 will be our best offering so far, with 23 specially curated sessions which delve deep into topics such as heritage, poetry, music, cinema and audio of Bangla language in this pristine heritage venue invaluable to Bangla literary legacy. This year the Utsob has curated specific session to pay a tribute and homage to writer and academic late Nabaneeta Dev Sen and to celebrate birth anniversaries of social reformer Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar and eminent writer Akshaykumar Dutta. In keeping with the objective of expanding the reach of Bangla Literature through this pioneering initiative, this year we have curated a very special event - Bishesh Sahitya Premi Sommanona to recognize people and organization who have been instrumental in spreading Bangla literature in its original physical form to the book lovers"



The session Bishesh Sahitya Premi Sommanona aims to recognize people like Tarun Shaw (55+) and Paritosh Bhattacharya (75+), book sellers of the city who have been selling and delivering books at the doorstep across the city for years. Besides, organization like Liluah WhatsApp Library, an initiative with 850 people with a huge database of Bangla titles will also be honoured and felicitated for their effort.

ABSU 2019 speakers include authors Shirshendu Mukhopadhyay, Sanjib Chattopadhyay, Shankha Ghosh, Samaresh Majumdar, Majharul Islam, Subodh Sarkar, Saikat Mukhopadhyay, Anish Deb, Debatosh Das, Himadrikishore Dasgupta, Pracheto Gupta and Srijato Bandopadhyay; Historians, professors and researchers Debasis Mukhopadhyay, Abhijit Gupta, Chinmoy Guha, Alokprasad Chattopadhyay; publishers Sudhanshu De, Rupa Majumdar, Majharul Islam, Esha Chatterjee; celebrated theatre personalities Sohini Sengupta, Chandan Sen, Sohag Sen and Sujoy Prasad Chatterjee; popular musicians Surojit Chattopadhyay and Parama Dasgupta; and Actors Rudranil Ghosh, Subhasish Mukhopadhyay and Saheb Chattopadhyay.

Where is Children's Literature Headed?)** a session dedicated to the memory of Late Nabaneeta Deb Sen acclaimed writer. Further illuminating discussions like Jekhane Somoy **Thomke Daraye: Sahitye Somoyer Chino (Only Time Will Tell: Does Literature reflect its contemporary times?), Kolponar Goyenda Vs Baastober Goyenda (Fact and Fiction: detectives from books vs real-life detectives), an engaging discussion among Nachiketa, Anish Deb, Bithi Chattopadhyay, Champak Bhattacharya (IPS), Rj Deep; Payer Tolae Sorshe, Bhromon Kori Jorse (Booked! Travel in Literature), a discussion among Meher Afroz Shaon, Surojit Chattopadhyay, Atri Bhattacharya, Satyam Roy Chowdhury will keep audience hooked throughout the day.**

Bidyasagar o Akshaykumar Dutta (Beyond 200! Celebrating Vidyasagar and Akshaykumar Dutta). Further illuminating discussions like Natokei Sahitya, Eha ki Sottyo (Staging Books: Can contemporary theatrical



writing considered literature?) a discussion among Sohini Sengupta, Sohag Sen, Chandan Sen and moderated by Sujoy Prasad Chatterjee; **Bhoot Banglar Rohoshyo (Hip Hip Horror!)** a discussion among Sirshendu Mukhopadhyay, Indrani Chakroborty, Joydeep Chakroborty, Syed Manjurul Islam and moderated by Binod Ghoshal; and **Boi Chai, Boi-o Chai, Dujonei Ekthai? (Literature & Cinema: Friends or Foe?)** A discussion among Rudranil Ghosh, Samaresh Majumdar, Swapnomoy Chakroborty and moderated by Alokprasad Chattopadhyay, will keep the audience engaged for the day as ABSU 2019 comes to a closure.
